Lernziele	The course has three aims: (i) making students familiar with the lively debate in experimental and behavioural economics; (ii) providing them with the methodological competence necessary to understand and judge original experimental research; (iii) provide formal tools for using so-called behavioural approaches in other areas of economics.					
Inhalte	This course presents psychological and experimental evidence of departures from perfect rationality, self interest, and other assumptions of more traditional economic studies. To do so, students are exposed to experimental methods, and a variety of experimental results are discussed. The course then explores different ways of how departures from standard assumptions can be captured by formal models. It also discusses the implications of these findings for positive and normative predictions in various institutional settings.
